## 2024 Common School Fund Distributions to Districts

In 2024, K-12 public school districts across Oregon will receive \$74.2 million from the state's Common School Fund.

The total amount distributed is 3.5 percent of the Common School Fund, which is currently valued at \$2.3 billion. Funds are provided to districts in two equal payments. The first payment was sent to districts in February 2024; the second payment will be sent in July 2024.

The Department of State Lands sends each total distribution to the Oregon Department of Education, which calculates the amount of money each school district receives based on the number of students per district. The calculation methodology is defined in ORS 327.410.

The table below provides the total amount each of Oregon's 197 public school districts will receive in 2024.

## **About Oregon's Common School Fund and School Lands**

The Common School Fund has supported Oregon schools since statehood, when the federal government granted our new state nearly 3.4 million acres "for the use of schools." The State Land Board – Oregon's Governor, Treasurer, and Secretary of State – was established to oversee these school lands, which generate revenue for the Common School Fund.

Today, approximately 681,000 acres of school lands in all 36 Oregon counties are managed by the Department of State Lands on behalf of the State Land Board. Ranchers and farmers, local governments, Tribes, businesses, and more work with the Department to lease and buy lands, plan for future community needs, and keep lands healthy.
