

OAR 141-083: Easements for Undersea Infrastructure in the Territorial Sea

FISCAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT:

Federal and state agencies, city and county government entities, special districts, and any member of the public who plans to apply for an easement or who holds an easement or encroachment issued under these rules or OAR 141-123, where use is located in the state's territorial sea, will be affected by the proposed changes. Those include the federal government, city or county parks or public works departments, Port districts, other special districts, and owners of other structures requiring authorization under OAR 141-083.

Impacts for each party will depend on several factors, specifically the number and type of authorizations the party has with the Department, when the authorization expires, and whether it is subject to renewal, and the physical characteristics of the use, among other considerations.

COST OF COMPLIANCE:
