



Restricted Use of State Lands on North Side of Hayden Island

The Department of State Lands has restricted overnight use, fires, and camping on the bank of the Columbia River along the north side of Hayden Island between river mile 106 and 107. The restricted area is located between the I-5 Oregon/Washington bridge and a wing dam along the west side of the beach, section 34, township 2 north, range 1 east, Willamette meridian, in Multnomah County, Oregon.

Effective May 9, 2022, the bank is closed to all uses between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. Campsites and fires are prohibited at all times. The area will continue to be open for day use.

The restrictions are to protect against damage to property, natural resources and the environment, as well as degradation of water quality.

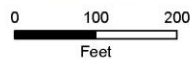

N. Hayden Island Emergency Closure

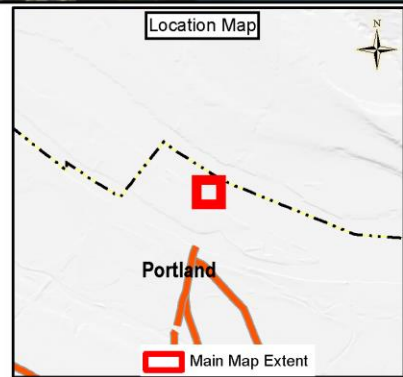
Columbia River; River Mile 106-107
