

With a little luck we will also see Harbor Seals hauled out on the lower reaches. Refuge volunteer and educator Carol Maude will lead the program. Bring your binoculars or borrow a pair from us. Please note: some may find the 130 steps down, and back up from the beach, beyond their capabilities so please take this into consideration before registering.
