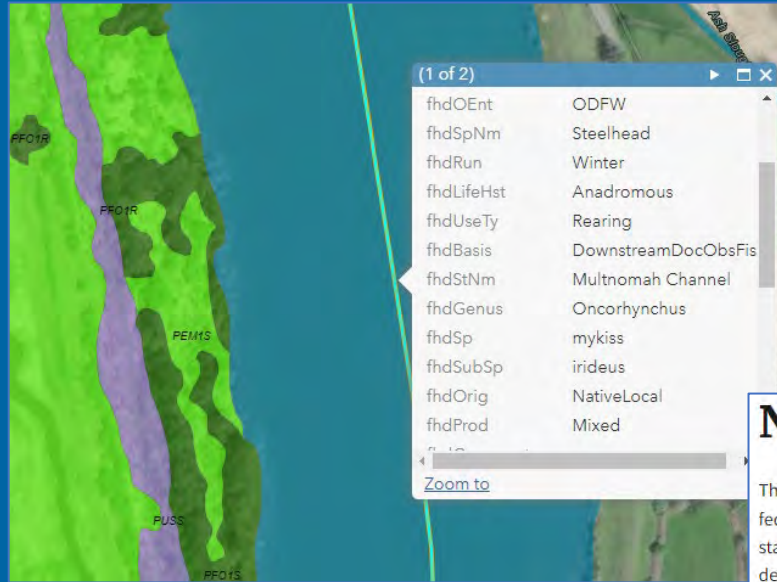
Vessel Characteristics

Environmental threat rating



National Response Center

The [National Response Center \(NRC\)](#) is a part of the federally established National Response System and staffed 24 hours a day by the U.S. Coast Guard. It is the designated federal point of contact for reporting all oil, chemical, radiological, biological and etiological discharges into the environment, anywhere in the United States and its territories. The NRC also takes maritime reports of suspicious activity and security breaches within the waters of the United States and its territories.

Reports to the NRC activate the [National Contingency Plan](#) and the federal government's response capabilities. It is the responsibility of the NRC staff to notify the pre-designated [On-Scene Coordinator](#) assigned to the area of the incident and to collect available information on the size and nature of the release, the facility or vessel involved, and the party(ies) responsible for the release. The NRC maintains reports of all releases and spills in a national database.

- Poses a threat to indigenous cultural resources
- Disproportionately impacts disadvantaged communities
- Has a severe impact on a local economy



Volatility rating

The instability of a vessel's situation and the tendency for it to change for the worse



Nuisance rating



Compounding factors

Unique characteristics that intensify existing concern

SITUATION: Your vessel, M/V EL CONQUISTADOR, does not have valid international or domestic certificates.

DIRECTIONS: Under the authority of the Ports and Waterways Safety Act, Title 33, U.S. Code 1221 et. Seq., and the regulations issued thereunder, Title 33, Code of Federal Regulations Part 160, I hereby order the following concerning the operation of the M/V EL CONQUISTADOR:

1. You are prohibited from moving EL CONQUISTADOR if the vessel does not possess a valid Certificate of Number, Certificate of Documentation, or Ship Registry.
2. You are prohibited from departing the port if you have not obtained all of the required international certificates and if the vessel's compliance with applicable rules and regulations in accordance with its safe manning document is not in compliance.
