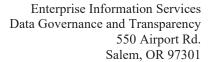

OSIP has historically struggled to secure long-term funding for statewide aerial imagery. Currently, OSIP requests funding each biennium. However, this approach lacks the stability necessary for a statewide program. The Long-Term Funding Strategy Report was funded during the 2023-2025 legislative session. In 2024, Enterprise Information Services contracted with The Sanborn Map Company, Inc. to develop a long-term funding strategy for OSIP. The final report and executive summary have been completed and have been made available as supplemental documents. Guest speakers from The Sanborn Map Company, Inc. will present on the findings presented in the final report.

AGENDA ITEM 5: Data Sharing Committee Update

SUMMARY:

The Data Sharing and Governance Committee (DSC) has not convened since April's OGIC meeting. However, the committee continues to work on completing phase 1 public body consultation process.

The following report provides a status update on the consultation process (see table 1) and a list of all data elements that have completed the consultation process (see table 2).

1. OGIC's endorsement for Public Body Data Sharing on all data elements that have completed the consultation process (Table 2).

REPORT:

Public Body Data Sharing

The Data Sharing and Governance Committee (DSC) has not convened since the April 2025 OGIC meeting, however, the committee continues to consult with state agencies on the public body data sharing process as outlined in the <u>Administrative Process and Procedures to Implement ORS 276a.509</u>, endorsed by OGIC in July 2023.

At this time, OGIC has initiated consultation with all 12 of the initial agencies. Table 1 outlines the overall status update and progress the DSC and OGIC representatives have made with the public body consultation process.

During the first round of consultations agencies were asked to verify, update, or appeal the request to share data. There are no open appeals at this time.

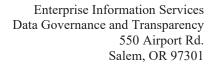
