3. Council Minutes Approval – Bob Cozzie – 1:35 PM

- Council Action: Approve Minutes from May 2022 Meeting
 - Motion to approve minutes: Roger Johnson / Seconded: John Hartsock
 - Minutes are approved, motion passed unanimously.

4. Committee Reports - Committee Chairs - 1:40

- Executive Committee Bob Cozzie
 - o Legislative Concept Update
 - Received a draft legislative concept that adds a member of the Emergency Management Community and a member of the Oregon State Fire Marshall's Office. We affirmed it's what we'd like in the draft.



- Will go back to Legislative Council, Director of DAS, and Governor's Office for final approval. Once approved, it will be pre-filed for the session going into next year.
- NASNA Interoperability Workshop Report
 - Bob Cozzie (Chair, SIEC), William Chapman (SWIC), Pat Lustig (OEM 911 Program), and Sean McSpadden (Legislative Fiscal Office) attended workshop for Interoperability goal setting.
 - Focus of event was on NexGen 911.
 - Should get a copy from NASNA soon of report and how Oregon is moving forward..
 - Three goals were set: Easy, Middle, Aspirational
 - Easy: NexGen 911 strategic plan is due shortly, hoping to have it approved in our next November meeting.
 - Middle: Define roles of all groups active in emergency communications.
 - Aspirational: NG-911 for Oregon by 2026.
- SIEC Tribal Representative Fact-Finding Trip Report (Klamath Tribe) Adam Haas
 - Had a good meeting with Klamath tribes; timing worked well as they've just setup their own police dept. and hired their Emergency Manager.
 - Talked about their radio systems, FirstNet, and deployables.
 - Great conversation around OrAlert; it's already paid for, they just have to opt into it.
 - Met w/ Cristal Stone, tribal member. She just became the Broadband Advisory Council representative.

Strategic Planning Committee – John Hartsock

- o NG-911 Working Group Report
 - Strategic Plan Status Update Very close to being complete. Received a draft to go over, planning on submitting to entire workgroup on September 6th. It will then go to all PSAPs and their areas. Plan to have an open session later in September and bring it back to this SIEC in November. Recognize that this is important.
- Bylaws and Charter Update
 - Draft was sent to group in Agenda packet.
 - Not many changes, just highlighting key alignments with the SCIP report and clarified terms of officers.
 - The Bylaws are new, haven't had them in the past.
 - Officer Terms were created: Chair, Vice Chair, Past Chair
 - Each are a 2 year term but a 6 year commitment.
 - A Quorum is 51% of the required positions, whether they're vacant or filled.



- State Markers Update 08/24/22 Robert Hugi
 - Went over presentation that was sent to group in Agenda packet.
 - Note with Slide 7: This is essentially a self-assessment of how everyone's doing.
 - Note with Slide 10: Oregon scores really well on the National level, increased from 2019.
 - Note with Slide 11: No states get a perfect score, but we'll still try.
 - Note with Slide 12: Planning to expand our program at the Federal Level
 - Note with Slide 13: Please take the SAFECOM survey when it's released!
 - Reviewing the State markers at a virtual meeting on 8/25.
 - We're using the markers to drive the SCIP update as well as justify tech assistance requests and grant funding.
