Employment Department phone access hours

The Oregon Employment Department closes for state holidays. We also set aside a day each month when phones are temporarily closed. We are still working during these days, but closing the phones allows staff to focus on processing reports and responding to employer requests. In addition to the Contributions & Recovery Division, Unemployment Insurance and Paid Leave Oregon will not accept inbound calls on the following days:

- Presidents Day (Monday, Feb. 17) and Tuesday, Feb. 18
- Wednesday, March 26
- Friday, April 18
- Memorial Day (Monday, May 26) and Tuesday, May 27
- Juneteenth (Thursday, June 19) and Friday, June 20
- Thursday, July 3, and Independence Day (Friday, July 4)

You can still send us a message through your [Frances Online](#) account during these days. Log in to Frances Online and select “I Want To...” and then “Send a Message” under “Messages.” Sending a message while logged in will help us respond more quickly.

To be eligible for unemployment insurance benefits, claimants must accept suitable offers of work. If claimants refuse a suitable work offer, their benefits may be denied.
