Upcoming deadline for payroll forms: March 31




Businesses and payroll services [must file](#) Form W-2G and Form 1099s by March 31, 2026 to meet annual filing requirements.

Submit the following forms through [Revenue Online](#): Forms 1099-MISC, 1099-G, 1099-R, 1099-K, or W-2G.

2026 Oregon Combined Payroll Tax Instruction Guide

Remember that **you must report all wages, for each employee, for each program, every quarter.**


