

# Unemployment Insurance Tax and Paid Leave Oregon Contribution Rates Hold Steady for 2026

The Oregon Employment Department (OED) mailed all individual tax rate notices on Nov.14. You can also find individual 2026 tax and contribution rate information in your <u>Frances Online account</u>. Here is a general summary:

 For all subject employers, the Unemployment Insurance (UI) taxable wage base limit is \$56,700 per employee. The taxable wage base is the amount

- of wages per employee subject to UI tax. The payroll tax rate for new employers (those with less than 12 months experience) remains at **2.4%**.
- For Paid Leave Oregon contributions: The total 2026 contribution rate is 1% of subject wages up to \$184,500 per employee.

Be sure to include **full wage information**, including any employee wages that are over the 2026 wage limits in your payroll reporting.

## 2026 Form W-2 and Form 1099 Filing Updates for Oregon iWire



Starting January 1, 2026, the Oregon Department of Revenue (DOR) will require all Form W-2 submissions, including those submitted using the DOR iWire spreadsheet, be filed through a Revenue Online account. Learn more on DOR's Revenue Bulletins webpage.
