

Oregon's Unemployment Rate Was 3.5% in June 2023






Unemployed Persons, Oregon Statewide








Labor force participation above pre-pandemic, but declining recently.


Oregon Labor Force Participation Rate

The jobs recovery has occurred unevenly across the state.


We're seeing slightly slower recovery in Lane County and in Southern Oregon.

Federal Reserve is attempting to 'thread the needle' for a 'soft landing'.




