

How to Use the Benefit Calculator

How to use the Benefit Calculator

To determine whether you may qualify for regular UI benefits, please use the [benefit calculator](#) and enter your earnings during the quarters specified. After you have entered your earnings, select [Click Here to Estimate Your Payments](#) to see your potential weekly benefit amount. The benefit calculator will check your potential eligibility under both a RBY and ABY claim.

Under Regular Unemployment Insurance (UI), your weekly benefit amount is determined based on your income (from employment) during your “base” year. The base year is a one-year period made up of the first four of the last five completed quarters. It is based on the date you file your claim application, not the date you become unemployed.

If you don’t qualify for a claim using a regular base year (RBY) you may still qualify for an alternate base year (ABY) using the four most recently completed calendar quarters. A calendar quarter is a 3-month period ending March 31, June 30, September 30 or December 31.

If you qualify for either a RBY or ABY, you must file a Regular Unemployment Insurance (UI) claim.

Oregon Unemployment Insurance Estimator

This site allows you to estimate how much your Oregon Unemployment Insurance Benefits will be before you file a new unemployment insurance claim. If you are receiving, or have received benefits on an existing claim, that claim must expire before a new claim can be filed.

Please enter the gross wages (amounts earned before taxes were withheld) paid to you in the quarters indicated below. If you were not paid wages during a given quarter, enter zero for that quarter. When entering your wages, do not enter dollar signs, decimal points, or cents.

You may use pay stubs and/or W2 forms to determine your wages. If you use the wage information on a W2 form, convert the yearly amount reported into quarterly amounts. Include wages paid for work performed in another state, for the federal government and for the military.

How to file for Extended Benefits (EB)

You are not able to file for Extended Benefits (EB) online.

To apply for Extended Benefits (EB), keep filing weekly like normal and you will be automatically enrolled if you are eligible. We also may reach out to you, so please turn off call-blocking features on your phone because our phone number will not show the call as coming from the Employment Department. We may leave a message if we do not reach you. Make sure your voicemail is set up and has space to receive new messages. If there is an interruption in payment, please let us know by using the [Contact Us Form](#).

If you claim a week of benefits and you do not meet the actively seeking work requirement, you will not be eligible to receive additional EB benefits until you worked in four (4) separate weeks and earned 4 times your weekly benefit amount (4 x WBA). Self-employment earnings do not count for this requirement.



Regular UI Weekly Claim	To start getting regular unemployment insurance (UI) benefits, you need to file a weekly claim. This is different than the initial claim. You have to file both to get your benefits. Help A weekly claim is how we figure out how much money to send you for that week. A week is Sunday through Saturday. You can't submit a weekly claim until the week is over. So if you filed your initial claim this week, you need to wait until Sunday to file your first weekly claim. To keep getting benefits, you need to file a new weekly claim every week. Filing a claim wrong can delay your benefits. And during COVID-19, the right answers to the questions on the claim form are different than you might think. If you are out of work due to COVID-19, use our step-by-step guides and videos to help you file your claim correctly.	
Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)	File a Pandemic Unemployment Assistance initial claim (this is the PUA application) or a PUA weekly claim. Help There are three ways to file a claim: 1) online claim form, 2) fax, or 3) mail. You will get paid fastest if you file your claims through the online form.
