





















"Heat pumps (space and water heaters) face barriers that limit adoption. With adequate policies to increase adoption, Oregon can reduce costs of the clean


energy transition"

- Expand residential access by funding organizations that can increase outreach and add repair funds to programs
- Adapt energy code for clean energy goals

Proposed Policy

- **CONTINUE** existing HP programs and **EXPAND** to target underserved customers
- **NEW**: incorporate rebates for repair funds and adapt energy codes towards points-based standard that favors low to no emission heating equipment
- **FURTHER STUDY**: Pilot programs to incentivize and compensate ratepayers for demand response


