Efficiency Standards Activity

23 NOV 2021

ODOE Submits Final Rules for Energy Efficiency Standards

The Oregon Department of Energy submitted final rules to the Secretary of State on November 23, 2021 to amend program rules for energy efficiency standards for appliances and other products. The rulemaking process included a public hearing on

Rule changes will:

- Align rules with House Bill 2062; Make housekeeping changes such as deleting obsolete references and renumbering
- Update Oregon's energy efficiency standard for computers and computer monitors
- Encourage rather than require manufacturers to also make similar requests to other states
 when they make a request for an alternative standard for electric storage water heaters;
 and
- Postpone the effective date from January 1, 2022 to July 1, 2022 for the demand response water heater standard in response to comments received during the public process and additional discussions with stakeholders regarding manufacturing delays.
