Michael Jung, energy and climate policy professional, Co-Chair

Michael Jung is a recognized energy policy leader with experience across cleantech, utilities, and government. He most recently led government affairs at Modern Hydrogen and previously served as founding Executive Director of the ICF Climate Center.

Michael has been an early team member at several successful clean technology startups, including Utilidata, Varentec (acquired by Sentient Energy), and Silver Spring Networks (acquired by Itron). He chaired an energy task force for Oregon Governor John Kitzhaber and crafted landmark electricity legislation as a policy advisor to Ohio Governor Ted Strickland's campaign and administration.



Margaret Hoffmann, Council Member on the Northwest Power and Conservation Council, *Co-Chair*

Margaret Hoffmann has worked extensively on public policy across public safety, health care, climate change, energy, and land use in both public and private sectors. Oregon Governors John Kitzhaber and Kate Brown appointed her as Energy Policy Advisor, where she developed Oregon's first 10-Year Energy Action Plan. She later served as senior management at Farmers Conservation Alliance, growing their irrigation modernization program across five western states and creating a \$1B pipeline of projects.

From 2021 to 2024, President Biden appointed Hoffmann as USDA Rural Development State Director for Oregon, where she led over \$1B in investments for broadband, entrepreneurship, clean water, and healthcare in rural communities.
