PROGRAM OUTLINE

- The program issues rebates and grants for the installation of heat pumps and related upgrades in rentals and manufactured dwellings or RVs in a rented space.
- Contractors apply for the rebate on behalf of their customer.
- Rebates are **paid to the ODOE-approved contractor** who installs the heat pump.
- The rebate and grant amount is passed on to the customer as savings on the cost to purchase and install the heat pump.





OREGON RENTAL HOME HEAT PUMP PROGRAM

2023 Legislative Session

- Extension of the program to January 2, 2026
- Change to household income criteria in description of program fund





RULE PROCESS

- Stakeholder consultation
- File draft rules with Secretary of State
- Comment period
- Review
- File final rules with the Secretary of State
- Rule effective





Proposed Rule Amendments

Change reserved fund language

 Align rules with changed language in statute

At least 25 percent of the funds must be reserved for rebates and grants for owners of dwellings occupied by **low- or moderate-income** households [whose income is less than 80 percent of the area median income].





PROPOSED RULE AMENDMENTS

Contractor Registration

- Allow contractors to attest to compliance.
- Expand compliance with requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Division to include abated violations and paid fines.

Reservation Process

 Allow contractor to attest that the heat pump is appropriately sized to the space or structure.




