

- Opportunity Announcement published February 24, 2023





#### REGIONS

Contract with one eligible entity for each region and one eligible entity for each federally recognized Tribe in Oregon.



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#### Eligible entities include:

- Local government
- Local housing authority
- Nonprofit organization
- Federally recognized Tribe in Oregon
- Coordinated care organization
- Community action agency
- Manufactured dwelling park nonprofit cooperative
- Electric utility

#### **USE OF FUNDS**

- Financial Assistance: Loans, grants, rebates, or other incentives.
- Prioritize financial assistance for:
  - Environmental justice communities.
  - Individuals who rely on bulk fuels or electric resistance heating.
  - Individuals who reside in a home or structure that does not have a functioning heating or cooling system.
