



2022

Senate Bill 1536 passed

Summer/Fall 2022

Initial outreach

Draft administrative rules published

Final administrative rules finalized



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Financial assistance for the purchase and installation of heat pumps and related upgrades.

- Assistance available to owners of:
 - Rental units does not include vacation occupancy or transient occupancy in hotel or motel.
 - Manufactured dwellings or RVs that rent a space in a manufactured dwelling or RV park
- ► Eligible contractors apply online.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE



Owner of a rental unit

\$2,000 - \$5,000 or 60% of purchase and installation costs of the heat pump

Owner of manufactured dwelling or RV that rents a space in a manufactured dwelling or RV park

\$2,000 - \$7,000 or 80% of purchase and installation costs of the heat pump

- ▶ The rebate amount is dependent on the cost and efficiency of the heat pump, and on the income level of tenants.
- For grants for related upgrades, the maximum grant amounts range from \$2,000 \$4,000, depending on the income level of tenants.

PROCESS

Contractor applies to program


Program reviews contractor eligibility

If approved, contractor granted access to apply for rebates

- Hold any required license, bond, insurance or permit
- Construction Contractors Board
- Worker's Compensation Insurance Coverage
- Occupational Safety and Health Division
- Bureau of Labor and Industries



PROCESS



Note the project requirements in rule relating to, among others: unit compatibility, sizing, installation location, permitting, warranties, and technical specifications.



APPLICATION

for rebate and grant reservations

List of required info, including but not limited to:

- Project info
- Heat pump info
- Sizing calculation information
- If applicable, income eligibility information
- Costs and other incentives
- Signed installation agreement
- If applicable, details related to upgrades





REQUEST FOR FUNDS

List of required info, including but not limited to:

- Permit
- Signed statement that customer received full value of rebate and grant
- Energy savings from installation





PROGRAM TIMELINE (TENTATIVE)

April 2023

Program administrative rules published

May 2023

Contractor registration form opened

June 2023

Rebate and grant reservation application announced and opened

June or July 2023 and Ongoing

ODOE reviews and responds to reservation requests
