



### INCENTIVE OVERVIEW

- 12,000 incentives of \$2,000 each
  - 6,000 incentives for **rental units**
  - 4,000 incentives for **new residential construction** (including rental units)
  - 2,000 incentives for **owner-occupied homes**
- One incentive per dwelling
- Applied for by contractors after installation with optional reservations
- Can be stacked with other non-federal incentives (ORHHP, CHPDP)



### PROGRAM COMPARISON

HEAT PUMP PURCHASE PROGRAM	OREGON RENTAL HOME HEAT PUMP PROGRAM
\$2,000 incentive for cost of heat pump (no grants)	Rebates (\$2-7k) and grants (\$2-4k)
Cap of 50 incentives per contractor business per quarter (200 annually)	No limit on reservations per contractor
Apply after installation ( NEW Reservations optional)	Reserve before installation
Available for homeowners, rentals, and new construction	Available for rentals/owner-occupied MH in rented space
Rental agreement not required	Rental agreement is required
LMI check box (for reporting)	LMI documentation required
Efficiency requirements: HSPF2 8.1, SEER2 16	Higher efficiency requirements – HSPF2 8.1, SEER2 16
1 step to receive incentive (submit)	2 steps to receive incentive (submit, project complete)
Can reapply if application is denied due to being incomplete	Ability to amend Incomplete reservations
Application can only be approved or denied	Ability to amend and withdraw applications



### PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

- Installed on or after program start date.
  - Yes, heat pumps purchased now due to the coolant change will be eligible if they are installed on or after the program opening.
- Installed by an ODOE approved contractor.
- Include a 5-year system warranty and a one-year labor warranty, be new, and provide heating and cooling for a living area of the home.
- Commercial properties, Vacation/transient occupancies are not eligible.
- Other requirements included in the HP3 Policies.



### **RESERVATIONS -- NEW!**


- Contractors can submit incentive reservations
- Reservations are optional; Contractors may submit applications without a corresponding reservation
- Full project eligibility not reviewed as part of reservations approval
- To claim a Reservation, contractors submits an Incentive Application and ODOE will match the Reservation and Application
- Reservations count toward incentive limits (50/quarter & 200/year)
  - Contractor Total = Reservations + Incentives Submitted without reservations
- Reservations hold one or more of the 12,000 incentives, but do not guarantee an incentive if federal funding is terminated




### PROGRAM BACKGROUND

- The Heat Pump Purchase Program (HP3) is funded through a Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) awarded to Oregon by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency.
- The CPRG grant is a reimbursable grant: Oregon does not receive grant funds up front.
- For HP3 Oregon only receives grant funds for incentives after incentives are paid to contractors.
- If grant funding is suspended by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency, ODOE will suspend the program until funding is once again available.
- If funding is term terminated U. S. Environmental Protection Agency, ODOE will necessarily terminate the program.
- Contractors will be promptly notified if funding is suspended or terminated.












### **CONTRACTOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION**

- Documents requested
  - W-9
  - Proof that OSHA violations resolved (if applicable)
- Licenses Required
  - CCB (No disciplinary actions from CCB within last two years)
  - BCD (Enter a subcontractor you typically use if you do not have one)
- Other requirements
  - Current worker's compensation insurance coverage
  - No non-complying employer order from the WCB within last two years
  - No OSHA violations within the past two years
- Training is required for existing and new contractors



### **CONTRACTOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION STEPS**


- 1. Click back into the HP3 program page.
- 2. <u>All</u> Contractors will need to complete an HP3 Registration
- 3. The main business account will need to be approved prior to registering other contractors within the business.






### NEW USER FOR CONTRACTOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION STEPS

 Main account must be approved prior to registering new users











### **RESERVATIONS**

- Submit project site address information
- Number of units within the project
  - 1 if single family
  - Up to 124 if multifamily
- Incentive caps
  - 50 per quarter up to 200 per year per Contractor Business
  - Contractor Business Total = Reservations + Incentives Submitted without reservations










#### **ELIGIBLE RESIDENCES**

- Address must be in Oregon
- New residential construction (including rental units)
- Rental units
- Owner-occupied homes
- Manufactured homes that are owner occupied and paying space rent considered as Rental Unit if there are no more incentives available in that category, can be owner-occupied home

### INCENTIVE APPLICATION

- Required Documents
  - AHRI Certificate
  - Final inspection from permitting agency as proof that the heat pump is associated with the project address (can upload a photo of mechanical minor label if applicable)
  - Invoice
    - Model information of the heat pump installed
    - Heat pump price (equipment only)
    - Total installation cost
    - Incentives received
    - Project site address
    - Warranty information (5yr against manufacturer defects and 1yr labor warranty)
    - Owner or Representative Signature
    - Contractor Signature







### INCENTIVE APPLICATION

#### Key information requested

- Owner Contact information
- Project site address
- Site utility
- Heat pump indoor/outdoor model information
- Efficiency requirements
- Heat Pump Purchase price
  - Only include the cost of the heat pump (no labor or other work done)
- Other Incentives
  - Amount
  - Description= Who the other incentive is from
- LMI
  - No documentation required. Only for reporting purposes
- Household type
- Heating type replaced









### **ODOE REVIEW PROCESS**


Program staff review submitted applications

Applications will be denied if...

- Project is outside of Oregon
- Installation prior to program start
- Installed in a commercial building
- Address changed (from reservation if previously reserved)
- Heat pump installed does not meet minimum efficiency requirements
- Missing or incomplete required information\*

\*Eligible to re-apply if denied
