

Weatherization Assistance for Consumer-Owned Utility Customers

The U.S. EPA awarded Oregon a \$197 million Climate Pollution Reduction Grant through the 2022 Inflation Reduction Act. The funding supports the state's Climate Equity and Resilience Through Action (CERTA) grant. Under this funding, the Oregon Department of Energy has \$800,000 to support existing weatherization programs and reduce greenhouse gas emissions and other harmful air pollution.

Weatherization makes a building's temperature more consistent during summer heat and winter chill and improves energy efficiency, which can lower utility bills and reduce emissions.


Eligible applicants include:

Existing weatherization programs for residential customers in the state's consumer-owned utility service areas, including areas serviced by:

- Municipal electrical utilities
- Consumer-owned utilities
- Electric cooperatives
- People's utility districts

Eligible weatherization measures:

- Attic, floor and/or wall insulation
- Window replacement
- Door replacement
- Duct sealing
- Air sealing



Applications Now Open Through March 27, 2026

Grant amounts

The grant amounts will be awarded based on the number of qualified applicants and available funding.

All grant funds must be distributed to program beneficiaries in incentives of up to \$2,000 per qualifying household.
