Frequently Asked Questions

What is Solar for All?

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency awarded Oregon a \$86.6 million Solar for All grant to support renewable energy adoption for low-income Oregonians. The grant is one of the largest ever investments to connect more people with solar energy and is part of a \$7 billion Solar for All program created under the Inflation Reduction Act. Oregon's Solar for All program is led by the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) and administered by a coalition of organizations, including ODOE, Energy Trust of Oregon and Bonneville Environmental Foundation. Solar For All funds in Oregon are intended to lower or eliminate barriers to solar installations for single-family homes, multifamily buildings, and community solar projects.

When will the incentives become available?

The program is under development and funding is expected to be available late Fall 2025.

Who qualifies for the rebates?

The program funds will be available to benefit low-income households and disadvantaged communities. As the program is developed additional information will be added to describe the criteria to qualify for the program.
