NOTICE OF DPO AND PUBLIC HEARING ON THE DPO

On March 12, 2020, the Department issued the Draft Proposed Order (DPO) and a Public Notice of a public hearing, to be held on April 23, 2020 at North Lake School in Silver Lake, Oregon. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and procedural issues, the public hearing was rescheduled and held on July 20, 2020 at the Christmas Valley Community Hall in Christmas Valley, Oregon, with an opportunity for both in-person and remote (WebEx and conference call-in) participation.

Department staff and all EFSC members attended the hearing on the DPO either in-person or via the live Webinar. The hearing was presided over by Senior Administrative Law Judge from the Oregon Office of Administrative Hearings, Joe Allen, an EFSC-appointed hearing officer for the proposed facility review. Individuals, including the applicant, had the opportunity to provide oral testimony in any of the provided formats (i.e., in-person, via the WebEx or phone, or written). Department staff and the hearing officer polled individuals wanting to provide comments to establish time limits for commenting. After public comments were provided, under OAR 345-015-0220(5), the applicant was provided an opportunity to respond to comments on the DPO.¹ In its responses to DPO comments, the applicant also requested that the record remain open for the applicant to have the opportunity to respond to written and oral comments on the day of the close of the public comment period. The hearing officer granted the applicant's request for the record to remain open until Wednesday, July 22, 2020 at

DPO COMMENTS AND APPLICANT RESPONSES

On July 10, 2020, the Department provided EFSC a staff report (with an attachment, Attachment 1 to that staff report) that included written comments received from March 12 through July 10, 2020 from the applicant, including its comments on the DPO and responses to comments from the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). In addition, the Department provided EFSC written comment letters from members of the public, organizations, legally-represented members of the public; and comment letters from reviewing agencies.

On July 22, 2020, in Attachment 1 of this cover letter, the Department provides EFSC the comments received on the DPO submitted in writing to the Department between July 10, 2020 and the close of the public comment period on July 20, 2020, which include comments provided in writing and orally at the public hearing. Additionally, in Attachment 2 of this cover letter, EFSC is provided the applicant responses to written comments received by July 16, 2020 and applicant responses to written and oral comments received from July 17, 2020 to the close of the public comment period on July 20, 2020.

Table 1: *DPO Comment Summary* below outlines all DPO comments received by members of the public, organizations, reviewing agencies, and the applicant. Table 1 also provides a list of applicant responses to DPO comments and reviewing agencies. All comments received from July 10, 2020 through July 22, 2020 are provided in Attachment 1 of this cover letter. Applicant responses to DPO comments are provided in Attachment 2. Between the July 10 staff report and this staff report, Council has received all comments on the record of the DPO, including the recordings from the July 20, 2020 public hearing.

The Department notes that several individuals and reviewing agencies, including SHPO and ODFW, commented several times. In turn, the applicant provided multiple responses to the comment letters and issues raised in the comment letters. Later versions of reviewing agency comment letters will reference the resolution of a concern; and applicant response to later-received agency comment letters, in turn, adopt recommendations from the agency comment letters. This will be further discussed during the DPO presentation at the July 24 EFSC meeting.
