## **Golden Hills Wind Project**

Request for Comments on the Complete Request for Amendment 5 and Draft Proposed Order,

and Notice on the Draft Proposed Order Public Hearing

#### **Summary**

Date Notice Issued: July 13, 2018

<u>Request</u>: Request for Amendment 5 (RFA5) of the site certificate to allow certificate holder flexibility in final wind turbine type and meteorological tower selection, changes in temporary access road and crane path design, and amendment of site certificate conditions.

<u>Facility Location</u>: Northern Sherman County (facility has not been constructed)

#### **Description of Approved Facility:**

The Golden Hills Wind Project (Golden Hills or facility) is an approved, but not yet constructed, 400-megawatt, wind-energy generation facility. The facility, as approved in the fourth amended site certificate, would include up to 125 wind turbines as well as related or supporting facilities, including: a power collection system, a substation, a 230-kilovolt (kV) transmission line, meteorological towers, supervisory control and data acquisition system, operations and maintenance facility, access roads, and temporary laydown areas. The current deadline to begin construction is June 18, 2020 and the deadline to complete construction is June 18, 2021.

## **Location of Approved Facility:**

The Golden Hills Wind Project is approved to be located in Sherman County, between the cities of Wasco and Moro, both east and west of U.S. Highway 97. The approved facility has not been constructed. A map of the facility is included at the end of this notice.

## **Proposed Changes in Request for Amendment 5:**

The certificate holder requests to amend its site certificate to allow flexibility in its final facility design, including larger wind turbine types that would increase maximum turbine blade tip height from 518 to 650 feet; increase the maximum turbine hub height from 312 to 404 feet; reduce minimum aboveground blade tip clearance from 65 to 46 feet; increase the height of meteorological towers from 312 to 404 feet; allow for expansion of temporary access roads from 40 to 100 feet; and, remove subsection (e) from condition PRE-DC-01 (which restricts the maximum combined weight of metals contained within turbine towers).

The certificate holder is not proposing to add area to the site boundary or micrositing corridors.

## **Comment Period and Public Hearing:**

Written comments on RFA5 and the draft proposed order must be received by the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) by the close of the August 23, 2018 public hearing, and must be submitted in writing by mail, email, hand-delivery or fax per below:

Written or oral comments may be provided at the public hearing. The Energy Facility Siting Council (EFSC) will not accept comments on RFA5 or the draft proposed order after the close of the record of the draft proposed order public hearing.

To be eligible to participate in a contested case on RFA5, a person must raise an issue either in person at the public hearing or in a written comment received by ODOE before the record closes on August 23, 2018 at the conclusion of the public hearing.

All comments submitted to ODOE may be disclosed to the public, subject to Oregon Public Records Laws (ORS Chapter 192). Public comments may be available on the ODOE webpage for the Golden Hills facility as an attachment to the proposed order.

#### **EFSC Review Process:**

After EFSC has reviewed ODOE's draft proposed order and considered all comments received on the record of the public hearing, as described in this notice, ODOE will issue a proposed order. The proposed order shall recommend approval, modification, or denial of the fifth amended site certificate.

Upon issuance of the proposed order, ODOE will issue a notice of an opportunity to request a contested case to all persons who commented on the record of the public hearing of the draft proposed order. This includes all individuals who submitted written comments to ODOE and all individuals who commented in person at the public hearing. Contested case requests must be submitted in writing to ODOE by a specified deadline that is contained within the notice.

Only those individuals who commented on the record, either in writing or in person at the public hearing, may request a contested case. To properly raise an issue in a request for a contested case proceeding, the issue must be within the jurisdiction of EFSC and must be raised with sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue. The issue must raise a significant issue of fact or law that may affect EFSC's determination that the facility, with the change proposed by the amendment, meets applicable laws and EFSC standards included in Chapter 345 divisions 22, 23, and 24.
