#### Administrative

### Roll call and opening remarks.

- Chair Wyatt opened the meeting at 2:30 PM
- Chair Wyatt conducted rollcall and introduced new Board members.
- The January 2025 Meeting Summary was unanimously approved.

#### **Board Opening**

#### **Oregon Department of Energy Updates**

Matt Hendrickson gave a presentation on where OHCB is at on the recent Holistic Negotiation at Hanford and the Milestones set for potentially grouting the 200 West(200W) tank waste. A major focus was the shared comments from OHCB, ODOE, and other Oregon affiliated entities that meaningful engagement on the transportation corridor and solidifying the material before transport is necessary. The discussion includes slides from previous work on transportation issues and recent changes revealed by the Supplemental Analysis of the 200W options. Also included were links and slides from DOE's industry day focused on the 200W project that included Land Disposal Restriction treatment, solidification, transport, and disposal.

#### **ODOE Update**

#### Washington Dept of Ecology Updates

Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program Manager, Stephanie Schleif, and Edward Holbrook, Deputy Program Manager, provided updates on education; Tri-Party Negotiations (including next steps for Holistic

Agreement and current status on M-15/M-16/M-85); low-activity waste commissioning; public involvement activities; and the Hanford Sitewide Permit.

Chair Wyatt led the Board in a discussion about the above-mentioned topics.

Sage DeLong, David Boothroyd and Steve March were officially welcomed to the OHCB. They were all recently appointed to the OHCB by Governor Kotek.

Chair Wyatt discussed the potential impact on Hanford cleanup decisions under the Trump administration.

Chair Wyatt discussed the Supreme Court's seven counties decision. The Board asked ODOE staff to monitor and report back on any changes that may have on Hanford cleanup decisions.

Mike Freeman led a group discussion regarding the cleanup of the 324 Building. The Board discussed the situation and what Oregon's response should be. It was decided unanimously (motion made by Mike Freeman and seconded by Jim Doherty) that the OHCB should request additional information about the impacts to worker safety and the environment in any formal comment letter at this time. The motion included a time frame of a week to finalize the draft 324 Building comments for on-line review by the Board prior to issue by the deadline of August 18.

Chair Wyatt discussed Oregon's concerns about liquified waste shipments that could come into Oregon and Governor Kotek's recent letter to U.S. DOE.

Regarding the fall OHCB meeting—Boardman, Oregon was discussed as a potential location in November. Mark Reese, ODOE staff, will investigate option for November 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> at The River Lodge in Boardman.
