A steward is responsible for taking good care of resources entrusted to it. In the context of navigatOR, Framework stewardship encompasses all aspects of effective data maintenance and appropriate access to it by users. Once data is developed, active maintenance is critical to sustain its usefulness and ensure its quality. Effective distribution must follow so that Framework data is accessible and used to make decisions. Given that each of our organizations has a substantial investment in spatial data and business processes that depend (or will depend) on it, everyone has a stake. Together we will establish flexible, sustainable stewardship arrangements that provide stability, continuity and accountability for Framework. The purpose of this workshop is to share concerns and approaches, collect ideas, and develop a common understanding as we incorporate stewardship into ongoing and emerging Framework development efforts.
