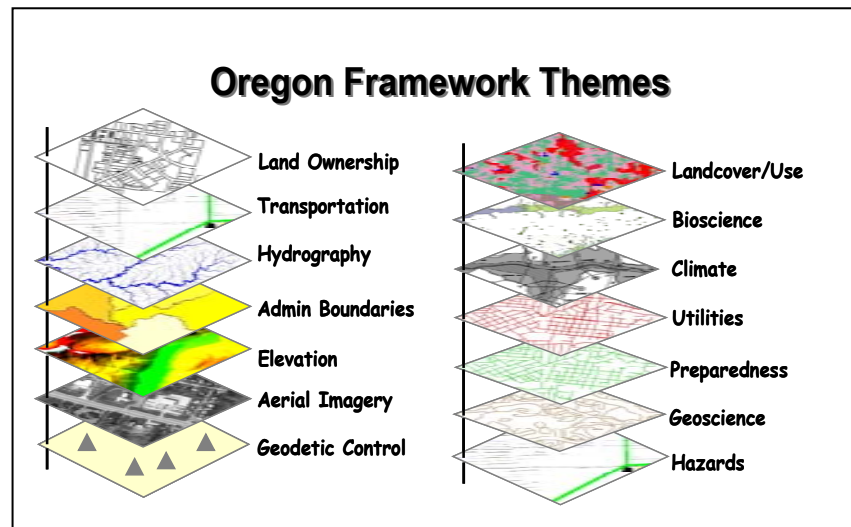
8th GIS Standards Forum

to be held on **December 7, 2006**, at the **Hotel Oregon** in **McMinnville**. This event is the eighth in a series of forums that are part of the ongoing process by the Oregon GIS community to develop and adopt statewide data content standards for geographic information. These semi-annual forums are used to present work in progress and to gather vital input and endorsement from GIS professionals statewide. Future forums will be held in other locations and focus on Framework-related workshops.

At the upcoming forum, the GIS community will be asked to approve standards for **Wetlands (Bioscience)**, **Land Cover Classification (LULC)**, **Floodplain (Hazards)**, and **Road Centerlines (Transportation)** (updated) for advancing to the Oregon Geographic Information Council for endorsement. By the time of the forum, the entire GIS community will have had an opportunity to review and comment on them.

The Oregon Framework Implementation Team has been tasked by the Oregon Geographic Information Council with developing and presenting appropriate data content standards for geographic information. The Framework Implementation Team's mission includes facilitating the development of such standards for the entire GIS community and ensuring consensus.

The following data themes have been identified by the Framework Implementation Team and approved by the Oregon Geographic Information Council for standardization and development.
