Commission Recommendations

Commissioners reviewed and discussed a draft of the COVID-19 recommendations. The recommendations were updated, and a vote was held to approve them.

Recommendations from the Governor's Foster Care Advisory Commission on COVID-related supports for youth in foster care:

- Technology support
 - ensuring reliable and affordable internet access
 - Specifically addressing access in rural areas
 - ensuring the availability of appropriate devices proportionate to the number of youth in the home
- Ensuring educational services continue in a timely manner
 - IEP assessments and testing
 - GED and high school completion requirements
 - Clear and timely communication regarding educational planning with families, including foster parents
- Ensure DHS visitations have clear guidelines that are in alignment with state executive orders and Tribal resolutions and ordinance for the health and safety of the children, families, and foster parents, including a plan for adherence.
- Supports to foster parents to help ameliorate increased stressors due to Shelter in Place/COVID
 - Examples:
 - Increased regular contact with their Certifier for additional supports or needs
 - Increased virtual supports and services for youth
 - Setting up Zoom meetings for groups of foster parents to meet.
 - Maintaining and expanding KEEP support groups throughout the state.
