



Project Updates

- **Access to Natural Resources, Support of Natural Resource Economy:**
 - Curry County Forest Collaborative Support
- **Business Retention, Expansion, and Creation:**
 - Fred Wahl Marine Expansion Facilitate regulatory approval of new dock to allow use of travel lift on Bolon Island.
 - Industrial Capacity Re-use Providing regulatory technical assistance in the redevelopment of the International Paper, American Bridge and other industrial sites in the region.
 - Riddle Laminators Cross Laminated Timber (CLT) Project to commercialize and market this innovative wood product for use in multi-story commercial construction.
 - BC Fisheries New shrimp and crab processing facility at Port of Brookings.
- **Workforce training :**
 - Youth Work Experience

Project Updates

- **Regulatory streamlining, technical assistance :**
 - Expedited State Permit for Coastal Ports' Maintenance Dredging Upcoming meeting Bandon "Barn" (senior center) on May 26
 - Douglas County Wetland Banking
 - Seafood Processor (Re-)Permitting
 - City of Oakland Water Intake Repair
- **Enhance Marine, Rail and Telecommunication infrastructure :**
 - Cannery at Port of Port Orford Assist through funding and permitting the replacement of cannery building damaged by high wind and wave winter storm.

S Coast Umpqua Region *Project Updates*

- **Build on Recreation Economy:**

- Coos Head Master Planning Provide funding and technical assistance to the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Tribe to prepare a master plan for redevelopment of the Tribe's 43 acre property on Coos Head.

- **Alternative Energy Development:**

- Natural Disaster Resiliency Supporting efforts within local coastal communities to improve preparation and response to seismic, wildfire, and flooding events.
- CHP – Brookings Evaluation of Combined Heat Power generation facility at Southport Lumber, which could provide emergency back-up power to critical community facilities in Brookings.

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Youth Work Experience

Pilot Definition per Staff Report for HB 5030:

- *Funding to local governments and other organizations for community infrastructure construction projects where these employers agree to provide work experience opportunities for teens and young adults.*

Key policy directions:

- Integration of work experience with capital projects
- Target: initial work experience/connection to labor markets
- “Community infrastructure”
- Project selection criteria
 - Work experience “quality”
 - Infrastructure project benefit
 - Leverage/alignment
- Advisory Committee/Sub-Committee Role
