



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 25-32

DETERMINATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY IN CLACKAMAS, CLATSOP, COOS, CURRY, DOUGLAS, HOOD RIVER, JACKSON, KLAMATH, LANE, LINCOLN, MARION, MULTNOMAH, TILLAMOOK, WASHINGTON, AND YAMHILL COUNTIES DUE TO A SEVERE STORM THAT INCLUDED HIGH WINDS, HEAVY RAIN, FLOODING, AND LANDSLIDES

WHEREAS, under ORS 401.165, the Governor of Oregon may declare a state of emergency by proclamation upon determining that an emergency has occurred or is imminent; and

WHEREAS, beginning December 8, a series of severe storms resulted in heavy rain, high winds, flooding, landslides, and erosion causing significant damage to the state roads on the federal-aid highway system and causing disaster conditions in Clackamas, Clatsop, Coos, Curry, Douglas, Hood River, Jackson, Klamath, Lane, Lincoln, Marion, Multnomah, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill counties.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tina Kotek, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under ORS 401.165, do hereby find that a threat to life, safety, property, and significant damage to the state roads on the federal-aid highway system was caused by severe winter storms and have caused disaster conditions in the above-listed counties beginning December 8, 2025, and continuing through December 31, 2025. These severe storms resulted in heavy rain, high winds, flooding, landslides, and erosion at various locations within these counties, leading to critical transportation failures and disruption to energy and communications infrastructure. This storm system damaged state highways throughout these counties with scour, sinkholes, debris flows, retaining wall failures, and landslides.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED AND DIRECTED:

1. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) shall provide appropriate assistance and seek federal resources to effect repair and reconstruction of \$25 million dollars or more in damages and impact to the federal aid highway system in the above-listed counties.
2. This declaration is limited to the above-listed counties. It is limited to the provision of assistance by ODOT to repair and reconstruct eligible roadways that are part of the federal highway aid system in the above-listed counties. This declaration is not to be construed as a comprehensive declaration or proclamation of emergency for other purposes.
