HPAC 8/11/2023 Consent Agenda Items

Additions to Topics for Work Groups

i. Availability of Land

- a. Efficient UGB swaps for constrained land on the urban periphery.
- b. Rural housing limitations constrain agricultural production

c.

ii. Land Development Permit Applications

- a. LUBA Urban Housing Docket
 - i. Carves housing approvals out of the definition of "land use decision"
 - ii. Housing approvals would include limited land use decisions, expedited land use decisions, etc. to clean up prior ad hoc policies
 - iii. Same timeline (21 days) and appeal fee (\$300) as standard LUBA appeal
 - iv. Appeal submitted online, limited to 250 words
 - v. No intervention, but LUBA administratively consolidates all appeals of a single housing approval
 - vi. Record limited to final decision including approved site plan
 - vii. Standard = obvious error
 - viii. 2 week turnaround for decision, following 21-day filing deadline
 - ix. If no obvious error, denial of appeal
 - x. If obvious error, remand to local government
 - xi. Remand process is an administrative decision by local government within 2 weeks
 - xii. No appeal to the COA for LUBA housing docket decisions

iii. Codes and Design

iv. Workforce Shortages

- a. State matches employer investment in workforce housing
- b. State matches employee salary for new/needed housing workforce

v. Financing

- a. Allowances for housing for year-round farm works in association with and proximity to at-scale farming operations
- b. Standardize lumber pricing for housing projects through terms in logging contracts. State either sets guaranteed prices for third-party sale, or state is the middle person (buys the lumber and sells to GCs)
- c. Standardize costs/availability of housing materials that otherwise have cost/availability volatility (state procurement and stockpiling)
- d. Financial contribution of state contractors that benefits from additional housing production
 - i. Electrical utilities
 - ii. Health care insurers
 - iii. Other?
