

Licensing


- Determine qualifications for licensure (education, exam, experience)

- Continuing education
- Forms, fees, and consumer outreach

Compliance


- Code of Ethics / Statutes /Administrative Rules
- Investigate complaints (unethical / unprofessional / unlicensed practice)
- Board review and vote on enforcement action
- Settlements / Contested Case Hearings / Appeals

BLPCT Practitioners- Year End 2024




BOP Practitioners - Year End 2024

Growth: Oregon Population & MHRA Licensees



Application Process Overview





Boards' KPM #4: EFFICIENT APPLICATION PROCESSING-


Average number of calendar days from completed license application file to application approval.

Compliance Volume

BLPCT has seen an unprecedented surge in complaint volume beginning in September 2024. The cause is unclear.



Recent MHRA Initiatives

- Efficiencies from MHRA structure- shared staff & resources. Licensing fee reductions for both boards in 2024
- Alignment of Board policies & procedures
- Diversity Study (published December 2022)- analyzed requirements across states; ongoing review & implementation
- Customer Service Improvements: timeliness, accuracy, and courtesy
- Explore Interjurisdictional Practice Compacts (PYSPACT & Counseling Compact)
- Implement SB 1512- Licensing Predeterminations (based on criminal history)
- Participate in BH workgroups & taskforces (BHTC, HB 4092, HB 4151, etc.); support others such as OHA & the HB 2235 Workgroup in their BH initiatives by providing info & sending surveys/info to licensees/registrants

Recent BOP Initiatives

2023

- Amended the foreign degree educational requirements for additional flexibility
- Established DEI Committee (November)

• 2024

- Revised endorsement application process by reducing required documentation applicants must submit- expedited the licensure process for out-of-state applicants
- Revised standards for supervised clinical experience that is completed out of state to remove barriers without compromising public protection
- Active and semi-active license renewal fees reduced by 23%

• 2025

- Revisions to Character & Fitness application and renewal questions
- Improvements and updates to application forms (in-process)
- Review/revise educational requirements to accept psychology programs accredited by the Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System (in-process)

Recent BLPCT Initiatives

2023

- Established DEI Committee (June)
- Reduced direct clinical experience hours requirements: 2,400 → 1,900
- Reduced marriage & family specific hours: $1,000 \rightarrow 750$
- Added flexibility to allow reciprocity applicants to substitute licensure for clinical experience

2024

- Late hours report submitted by registered associates no longer denied
- Supervision reporting frequency: 6 months → 12 months (with renewal)
- Registration renewal fees (annual): \$120 \rightarrow \$105 (-13%)
- New limited permit option (HB 3300)- facilitate temporary practice mobility
- Relaxed requirements for supervisors to qualify
- Reduced paperwork and expedited process/requirements for reciprocity applicants licensed ≥ 3 years
- Removed Professional Disclosure Statement submission requirement (HB 4010)- major bottleneck

2025

- Revisions to Character & Fitness application and renewal questions
- Improvements and updates to application & registered associate forms
- Presentations to Oregon graduate programs
- Review/revise educational requirements for unaccredited programs (in-progress)

Looking Ahead - Talent Council and Beyond

- MHRA/Boards will continue to solicit feedback, evaluate, and refine requirements/processes as appropriate
- Talent Council work on establishing common terminology, understanding, and strategy will facilitate boards' navigation of issues of scope or duplication of effort in creating/regulating new credentials/licenses
- New improved licensing system (database)
