Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs Presented by Dr. Nakeia Council Daniels	*Power Point* department serves all 266k + vets. Wartime vets have different needs than peace-time vets. A lot of vets are aging out of services. Veterans of color are expected grow significantly. Need to aggregate data for Oregon, not just federal. Women vets are also on the rise. Need to get state-specific data for Oregon, not just federal.	
	Not much data on incarcerated vets. Transition support is way different for vets than others. Support is minimal for vets. Trying to increase coordinators for incarcerated vet program. Houseless vets have very nuanced needs. Slide 5 – new grant Program only at state pen right now.	
	Meg: vets need more help. Help is there and then gone. Has that changed. Dr. Daniels – not yet. We are only as good as our partners. Courtney Place is an apartment complex for vets, that was created through partnerships. Dependent on partners. Housing tends to be harder for women.

Oregon Housing and Community Services Andrea Bell / Chelsea Bunch / Natasha Detweiler-Daby / Keeble Giscombe / Liz Weber	*power point* lack of housing, high rent. Higher impact for people of color. Don't just point at data, do something about it. Vested interest in ensuring values are upheld. Need collective shared progress. Budget is submitted 9/1. Gov Budget submitted in December. Will not be replica of gov recommended budget. Need concrete improvements, make everyday life better. Measuring progress in not just numbers, but on how people are actually doing. Make sure we can upgrade existing investments. Jackie: Is there something in place for persons presenting with IDD transitioning into their own home? Andrea: part of the proposal is to fine-tune services, and part of that is providing appropriate support for people that need it. Natasha: In our ARB the supportive housing expansion the concept is to more explicitly provide supportive housing structures for those exiting facilities. Meg: which agency should provide support and training in rural cities regarding culturally specific developments? There' a lack of understanding about equity and diversity in rural places. Chelsea: we are very data driven, but we need more thoughtful partnership. There's misunderstanding in rural communities, and that there aren't a ton of people of color in a lot of places. We need education, and to be clear about 'Why' and 'How' in ensuring that communities are meeting the required needs. Education and baselining for this is important. Meg Q 2: home ownership, the program is moving forward but the reality is that the agencies like Bienestar and FHDC can not support the staff needed to continue this work. I would like to know if there will be some financial support. Please note that Bienestar and FHDC are collaborating in homeownership, we hope that by doing this we don't duplicate positions and decrease our cost. Still we are not making it!
