Review of Letter Priorities (20 Minutes) to begin planning for future priorities on workplan and implementation	<i>Javier reviews work plan. Chandra provides legislative updates.</i> Chandra: With bills there is a more conservative approach to fundings. They are all sitting in Ways and Means (W&M). Expecting the W&M closing end of this week. Unfortunately, a lot of the bills did not make it through this session. Particular items noted in your letter did not make it across the finish line, but a lot of interests in the GRB asks will likely make it across. We should still push forward. Anca: Senate Bill 1154, which takes the lessons learned from our approach to LUBGWMA to future potentially contaminated regions (process improvements and additional tools for agencies to be successful, more quickly), is still in play. Javier: Short session is in February. Chandra: Don't know how much policy related conversations will happen in February, likely more budget focused. If you reaffirm your commitment to overarching priorities, we can do what we did before and have different agencies report out on how they are thinking of their Environmental Justice priorities and how things are looking like.	

	<p>Javier: Maybe in August we start thinking of those agencies and tie them in with preexisting.</p> <p>Ana: Agree, think it also ties with community resilience hub. It would be great to hear back from the agencies on our priorities and hear how funding went through.</p> <p>Chandra: Jonna would be a good start; she has new staff and has several new developments.</p> <p>Anca: I get heads up from agencies since I'm on the communications side. Can bring a list to share with Javier and Yasmin to help guide any next steps.</p> <p>Chandra: We will be thinking ahead about next long session. Would like to hear your perspective on policy areas that may have been missed and where we can help lean in.</p>
