


# Figure 6: Forest Acres Treated






## Figure 2: NEPA Decision Acres





### Figure 3: Stewardship Contracts

■ Dry mixed conifer





# Policy Evolution


- Healthy Forest Restoration Act (2003)

**HUC: Hydrologic unit code.**

The U.S. Geological Survey developed this classification system as a way to categorize watersheds. The smaller the number, the bigger the geography. (e.g. HUC 1, HUC 2, HUC 3, HUC 4, HUC 5, HUC 6)  
 Average HUC 6 watershed is approximately 20,000 acres. Average HUC 5 watershed is approximately 150,000 acres.
