Recap of previous meeting:

Since the first meeting of this working group, three public members were added: Linda Kozlowski, Keith Tymchuk, and Mark Winstanley.

Purpose of the Governor's Office Tsunami Working Group:

Wanted to get the right state agencies in the room to get everyone on the same page and to hear what everyone has to say.

Agency updates:

Agencies that had any updates or news related to bills affecting the tsunami line:

DOGAMI: Met with Rep Gomberg re: HB 3309

Biz OR: Seismic rehab grant committee met, touched on permitting rules, 12-0 to allow schools within the inundation zone now are eligible for funding in rule making. HB 5005 in Ways & Means now.
DCBS: Building codes division is in DCBS, that's why Cameron is included. 2019 OSSPAC states buildings are not prohibited in tsunami line but must be built in the highest standard if SCE 7-16 is adopted in the future by DCBS-BCP.

Housing: Prior to his meeting they have not been engaged outside of this group in regards to housing and building on the coast. They will start to look at current lines in terms of affordable housing. SB 850 (2017) has two reports that could provide additional information

Rep. Gomberg's office: Everyone is well aware of the concerns. Questions that the legislator has are:
DLCD: goal 7, different natural disasters – treating tsunamis different than earthquakes. Equity lens /

poorer communities that lie within the zone; if shifting the blue line east, are the urban growth boundaries shifting as well.

- Between now and next meeting HB 3309 will probably move, as it's currently written it would remove regulatory authority away from DOGAMI and finding a new home for it.
- Coastal caucus hasn't discussed ASCE 7-16 line at this time.

OSSPAC (Jeff): What are you going to do with the line, regardless of which line is used? It's all about what you want the community to look like after a tsunami. Critical decisions to make re: live safety (Linda W)

OSU (Dan): Leaving the community to decide gives the community more to work with
