






- Be creative while exploring data sources that can be used to create indicators.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS -

- Measurability Can the data be easily measured quantitatively?
- Availability How easily are the data obtained?
- Simplicity Is the indicator intuitive and easy to interpret?
- Affordability Are the data collection costs affordable?
- Credibility Is the indicator trustworthy to the intended audience?
- Relevance Does the indicator align with goals of tool?






