### **Oregon Private College Week**

Oregon Private College Week took place July 25-29 – this was our third year.

- 5,971 visits
- 13.2% more than last year
- Represented 27 states and 6 countries
- 54% of the visits were made by Oregonians
- 20% by Californians
- 18% by Washingtonians

### **Graduation Rates**

Nationally, in 2015 the six-year graduation rate for 4-year non-profits is 64%. In Oregon that number is about 6% higher.

Graduation Rates for our traditional students (Full-Time First-Time, Degree-Seeking) are high and consistent from year to year rising from 67% in 2012 to 70% in 2015.

Graduation Rates for the traditionally underrepresented groups have steadily grown over the past five years and now equal our overall rates. The steady increase of our underrepresented minority graduation rate is particularly noteworthy, having increased from 52% in 2011 to 71% in 2015.

Overall, our minority enrollment (which includes Asians, Native Hawaiians, and Two or More Races) is 32% of all our U.S. resident students whose ethnicity is known.

For our underrepresented minority enrollment (Black/African-Americans, Hispanics, and American Indian/Alaska Natives) that figure is 15%.
