Draft Institutional Profiles

Summary:

To further the Commission's reporting goal, the Office of Research and Data has developed institutional profiles for each of the 24 public institutions. These profiles are designed to provide empirical descriptions of the state as a whole and of each community college and public university. They are aimed at a wide audience, including the Commission, our institutional partners, members of the public (including students, families, and the media), the Legislature and other government entities, and policy makers in other settings. They provide information on many questions frequently asked of the HECC. We expect to publish final versions of the profiles at the end of 2017 or the beginning of 2018. They will be available in printed, one-page versions for individual institutions and the state, a combined file with all institutions and the state-wide profile, and on the HECC website. The profiles will continue to undergo refinements until that time, including populating them with the most recent data and including a comprehensive list of the measures' definitions on the back. We plan annual publication with updated data each year.

We are now at a stage in this process where we invite Commissioners' feedback on the draft. The draft below is the statewide version of the profile and represents students in all of our public institutions. The profile centers around three concepts: enrollment, affordability, and completion. Each of these areas has an overall measure on the left, six components of the concept in shaded boxes in the middle, and a text box on the right that highlights a finding related to equity. We have data for all of these measures, with the exception of institutional grant and scholarship aid in the affordability section, which we have requested from the institutions. The profiles for each institution will look nearly identical to this statewide version with only a few relevant points omitted (e.g., graduate degrees from community college profiles). We look forward to your feedback at the meeting or sent to me directly.



(Public Institutions, Oregon Residents)



Students of color are increasingly represented on college and university campuses. Currently **29%** of higher education students are students of color.




