

## ACRONYMS

AAOT	Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer: a 90 credit statewide transfer degree
AAT	Associate of Arts Transfer: a new 90 credit statewide transfer degree created for Major Transfer Maps that aligns with lower division degree requirements for a Bachelor of Arts.
AB	Applied Baccalaureate: Oregon's community colleges now have the choice to design and offer (after HECC approval), a new type of degree known as an 'applied baccalaureate' (AB). These are bachelor-level, workforce-oriented programs that prepare Oregonians for high-value career opportunities with Oregon's most active employers and industries
APA	Office of Academic Policy and Authorization at the HECC. This office oversees two primary areas of work: 1) the quality, integrity, and diversity of private postsecondary programs in Oregon for the benefit of students and consumers, and 2) public university academic policy and program approval.
ASOT-B	Associate of Science Oregon Transfer – Business: a 90 credit statewide transfer degree for potential Business major
ASOT- CS	Associate of Science Oregon Transfer – Computer Science: a 90 credit statewide transfer degree for potential Computer Science majors
AST	Associate of Science Transfer: a new 90 credit statewide transfer degree created for Major Transfer Maps that aligns with lower division degree requirements for a Bachelor of Science.
BA	Bachelor of Art is a four-year undergraduate degree with certain degree requirements. In Oregon, many BA degrees require second/world language courses
BS	Bachelor of Science is a four-year undergraduate degree with certain degree requirements. In Oregon, many BS degrees require specific coursework in math, science or computer science.
CAO	Chief Academic Officer
CIA	Oregon Council of Instructional Administrators/Chief Academic Officers The group of community college instructional deans and vice presidents from the transfer and technical programs. It is concerned with planning and exchanging information.
CCWD	Community College and Workforce Development (CCWD) provides coordination, leadership and resources to Oregon's 17 locally-governed community colleges, 17 adult basic skills providers, community-based organizations and other partnerships. The governance of Oregon's public community colleges is the responsibility of their respective local-elected governing boards.
CSSA	Council of Student Services Administrators The group of community college deans and vice presidents concerned with student services. It plans and exchanges information.

CTM	Core Transfer Map (referred to in HB 2998 as Foundational Curricula): groups of eight general education courses, equivalent to at least 30 credits that transfer to any public university in Oregon and apply to the university's degree requirements.
ESD	Education Service District: Oregon has 19 Education Service Districts tasked with supporting needs of local school districts and communities.
HB	House Bill. A law or proposed law introduced by a member or committee of the House of Representatives. In implementation contexts, typically referred to legislation that has passed and been signed into law by the Governor
IFS	Inter-institutional Faculty Senate: a group of faculty senators from the seven public universities and Oregon Health Sciences University
MOU	A memorandum of understanding (MOU) is a document describing the broad outlines of an agreement that two or more parties have reached. MTM	Major Transfer Map (referred to in HB 2998 as Unified Statewide Transfer Agreement): a 90 credit, major specific statewide transfer tool which has been rebranded and is now referred to as a Major Transfer Map
OAR	Oregon Administrative Rule These are the regulations issued by state agencies in order to implement and define statutes (also see ORS).
OCCA	Oregon Community Colleges Association: a community colleges advocacy and policy non-profit organization
OCOP	Oregon Council of Presidents: a voluntary association of public university presidents
OPC	Oregon Presidents' Council: a voluntary association of community college presidents
ORS	Oregon Revised Statutes. A reference to an ORS number is a reference to a specific statute. Statutes are updated every two years, and the meaning of a statute may be modified by yet unpublished revisions made by recent legislation.
OSA	Oregon Student Association: a student-led advocacy non-profit organization
OTAC	Oregon Transfer and Articulation Committee
OTM	Oregon Transfer Module: a 45 credit suggested first year curriculum for community college students who plan to transfer to a public university

SB	Senate Bill. A law or proposed law introduced by a member or committee of the Senate. In implementation contexts, typically referred to legislation that has passed and been signed into law by the Governor.
SPC	Statewide Provosts' Council
USTA	Unified Statewide Transfer Agreements were the original name of Major Transfer Maps under HB 2998 (2017) before it was rebranded to MTMs in order to promote recognition and understanding.
