Senate Bill 233: Overview

- ✓ Establishes a Transfer Council
- ✓ Adopt a common course numbering system
- ✓ Establishes a Transfer Council as an advisory body over CTMs & MTMs
- ✓ Requires HECC to submit a report on legislation or funding needs for an electronic system needed for CTM and MTMs (and other credit transfer)
- ✓ Rulemaking Authority

Rulemaking 101:

“Administrative Rules are created by most agencies and some boards and commissions to implement and interpret their statutory authority”

Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR)



Senate Bill 233: Significant Change

SB 233 gives the Commission authority to make rules regarding statewide transfer and articulation informed by recommendations from the Transfer Council.

Senate Bill 233: HECC's Role

Rulemaking

- ✓ Establish CCN by rule by September 1, 2024, including creating any rules that ensure its establishment by 2023-2024 AY (*Section 2 (3)(b)*)
- ✓ Establish Transfer Council terms of office (initially every 2 or 3 years & ½ are appointed annually) (*completed*)
- ✓ Establish a student appeals process
- ✓ Review Transfer Council rule-making recommendations for CCN and MTMs, and adopt rules as appropriate
- ✓ Establish in rule, maintenance and reporting of CCN & MTMs
- ✓ Establish in rule a HECC legislative report due date that reports on effects of CCN, CTM, MTMs, overall and by institution and subgroup

Senate Bill 233: Transfer Council's Role

Rule Recommendations to Commission:

- ✓ Establish and maintain CCN work
- ✓ Audit process to ensure implementation and compliance

✓ Student Appeal Process

✓ Successful implementation of MTMs

Timeline: Transfer Council for Rule recommendations for MTMs

Date	Venue	Action
May 19 th	Transfer Council Meeting	TC discusses draft MTM Rule recommendations (drafted and presented by HECC staff)
June	Transfer Council Meeting	TC votes on final recommendations for MTM Rules
July	Higher Education Coordinating Commission	Initiates Public rulemaking process
<i>Monthly</i>	<i>Transfer Council Meeting</i>	<i>Update from HECC staff or Commission ex-officio on rulemaking process</i>
August	Higher Education Coordinating Commission	Rule making process posted with (60-90 days) for public comment
September	Higher Education Coordinating Commission Meeting	Rulemaking authority on SB 233 discussion
October	Higher Education Coordinating Commission Meeting	Commission Votes on MTM Rules
November	Transfer Council Meeting	Informational agenda items: final MTM Rule approved by Commission
