



Future Ready Oregon: Prosperity 10,000 Grants and Subawards

November 15, 2025

Future Ready Oregon (Senate Bill 1545, 2022) included \$35 million for Prosperity 10,000 grants. Oregon’s nine local workforce development boards distributed funds to nonprofit community-based organizations, educational institutions, labor organizations, and other workforce service providers to offer services. These services include career coaching, paid training opportunities, scholarships, stipends, and wraparound supports. The local workforce development boards have invested in innovative approaches to addressing regionally significant workforce needs, expanding existing relationships, and advancing new partnerships. All nine boards received their first allocation of \$15 million in state General Funds (GF) based on a formula funding model in May 2022. All GF were required to be spent by June 30, 2023. They received their second and final allocation of \$20 million in American Resue Plan Act (ARPA) funding in early 2023. ARPA funds must be fully used by June 30, 2026.

RWP	Golden Rule Re-entry	\$249,038.00	Women & Incarcerated Individuals	Construction	<p>A cohort will be comprised of 6 participants that are at least half of whom are women.</p> <p>Participants will be given a \$500/week stipend to alleviate the burden of undergoing extensive training in preparation for permanent placement in well-paying construction jobs. The formerly incarcerated population, more than any other, experiences barriers to employment and social alienation. By training the reentry population through this program, Golden Rule is moving a priority population into what they call the “Prison to Prosperity Pipeline” giving them valuable skills to be leveraged into well paying positions, increasing hope for the future and breaking cycles of poverty and hopelessness. This program builds the hard and soft skills necessary to thrive in the workplace, while also providing social and emotional support, through year round programming and network of other services to ensure that our participants’ needs are met both in and outside of the workplace. All participants will have access to case management and peer support throughout the training and well into the future as needed.</p>

RWP	Project Youth Plus	\$63,035.85	All	Construction & Healthcare	<p>The Project Youth+ Future Ready ARPA program will be housed under its Career Build program and will serve youth ages 17 to 24 in Jackson and Josephine counties. Qualifying youth attending any school in these areas will be eligible as well as those who have dropped out or have otherwise not completed high school. The target workforce need in healthcare is for certified nursing assistants (CNAs), CNA2s, phlebotomists and medical assistants. These positions are in high demand, with CNAs alone making up 20% of all healthcare vacancies in Oregon. In construction, the need is for youth to be ready for apprenticeships in general construction and electrical work. Construction employers specifically report “an insufficient quantity of apprenticeships is creating a log jam in the pipeline” (/www.oregon.gov/workforceboard/data-and-reports/). Under the goal of filling high-demand jobs in high-demand sectors in Southern Oregon, youth will be offered occupational skills training in healthcare, and will be offered a pre-apprenticeship training in construction trades. Additionally, youth will receive on-the-job training (OJT) with an employer whereby the employer is reimbursed for the first 150 hours of the youth’s employment with them. Some of these OJTs may be offered to the youth who complete healthcare or construction training as part of this program. Therefore, a total of 38-52 unduplicated youth is projected to be served by this grant. Each youth who participates will be connected with a coach who will work alongside them before, during, and after their professional training and job placement. Coaching relationships include individual assessments and skill building around the employability skills most needed for each youth. These youth will be provided regular one-on-one mentoring and barrier removal services including purchase of identification, transportation vouchers, interview or work clothing, supplies needed for work, and additional incidentals as needed.</p>

Most people who benefit and pursue this program are those who typically have minimal education, are from lower income families, sometimes have other family obligations preventing them from otherwise pursuing further education, and are predominantly female or of an ethnic minority, or both. Expand current program offerings to include a Medical Billing and Coding course for those who are not drawn to a career in direct patient care. Plan to utilize a small portion of the funds for other supplies that have historically been unavailable to students. Examples include stethoscopes, scrubs, watches, and even footwear. While these are not large expenses individually, they can be substantial and potentially limiting purchases for many in the community.
