General education courses may be used to meet COCC certificate/degree requirements or to transfer to most Oregon community colleges and universities. ACC instructors must meet college credential requirements established by each instructional department and the courses must align with CCC course requirements and curriculum content. Tuition, textbook(s), class fees are covered by the school district, however, students are responsible for the cost of their transportation.
