General education courses may be used to meet COCC certificate/degree requirements or to transfer to most Oregon community colleges and universities. ACC classes are college-approved courses delivered at the HS and taught by college-approved HS instructors. ACC instructors must meet college credential requirements established by each instructional department and the courses must align with CCC course requirements and curriculum content. High School Diploma: Students take dual credit classes at PCC that apply to their high school and college transcript, while completing their high school diploma.
