(L) Concordia University-Portland has approximately 200 nursing students (this is the only program at the University), who are mostly female students. The program is also offered in a hybrid format where many classes are offered online and students do not have to travel to campus. These factors contribute to a low rate of sexual misconduct reports. In addition, in July 2025, we entered into an MOU with Call to Safety to provide education and advocacy to our students.
