All are available to students via the MyIOT student portal and on the iot.edu website. These policies are provided to all prospective students, distributed annually on or before October 1st, and are reviewed during orientation. All incoming students receive annual Title IX and Clery Act training via the MyIOT student portal.

During orientation, and throughout enrollment, the Student Services department provides access to student support materials and makes students aware of the services they offer and how they can help. Additionally, they partner with local agencies to either share resources, or have representatives visit the campus.
