The uses of those services are up to the individuals, and which services they chose to access. Our office can assist with accessing some services, but counting and tracking all services may be a violation of privacy laws or an individual's privacy.

(L) Section I is also very difficult to track, and numbers in section I are based on the number of students the institution has certain knowledge of.

Overall these numbers only capture reported sexual misconduct to the Title IX office and the breakdown of those reports. They do not capture the overall impact of the this office and the total number services offered. Nor do they capture other services on campus that are providing supports to people who have experienced some form of sexual misconduct, either currently or in the past, and have either reported to a confidential source, or not reported.
