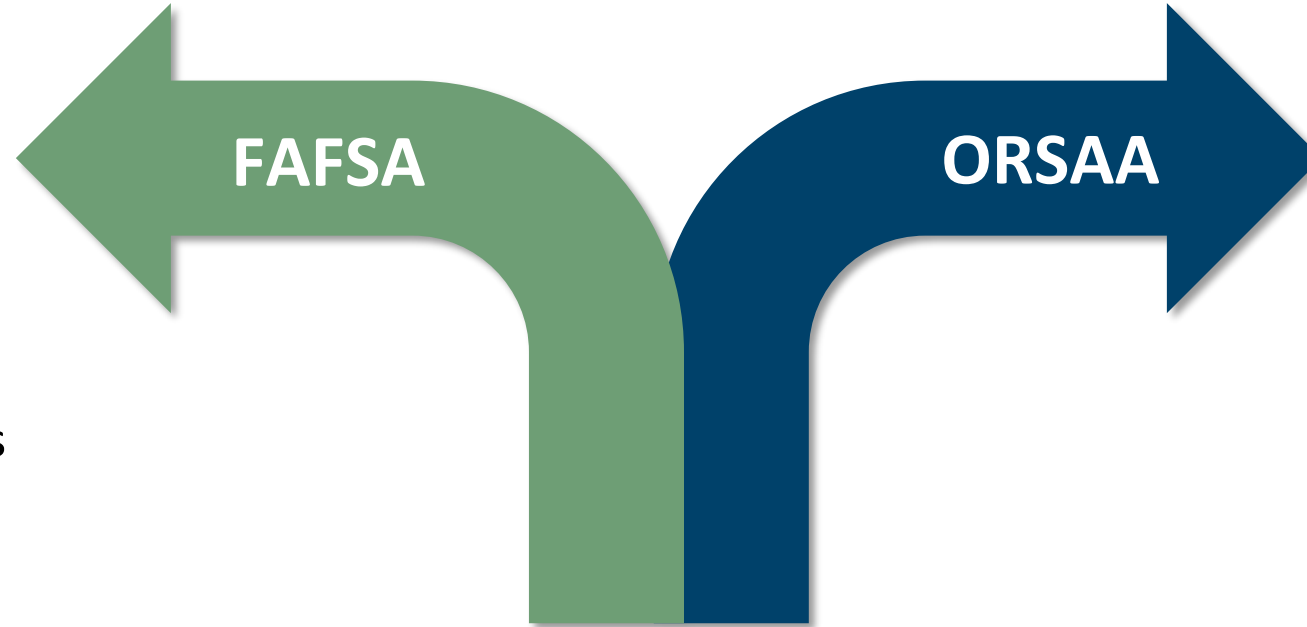

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FAFSA/ORSAA Eligibility



FAFSA:

- U.S. Citizens or eligible non-citizens
- Used to access Federal and State financial aid, and many scholarships

ORSAA:

- Oregon students who are undocumented, or have DACA/TPS/U-visa status
- Used to access state financial aid, and many scholarships

Better FAFSA/ORSAA

What we know about changes to the FAFSA and ORSAA

- 1 The 2024-25 FAFSA launched 12/30/23 and the 2024-25 ORSAA launched on 1/19/24, along with additional processing delays for both applications
- 2 The Expected Family Contribution (EFC) has been replaced by the Student Aid Index (SAI)
- 3 The look and feel of the ORSAA remains the same as the 2023-24 application
- 4 If students/parents have existing ORSAA accounts, continue to utilize them. Do not create duplicate accounts
- 5 Don't panic, we are here to help



How does this impact you?

ORSAA Security


- The ORSAA is a confidential application that is used solely by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to qualify students for financial aid in Oregon.
- It is not used for federal financial aid purposes. Information that is shared with the HECC via the ORSAA is used only by the HECC and partner colleges, universities, and foundations in order to administer grants and scholarships.
- The HECC does not share data with any other agency, state or federal. The HECC will do everything within its authority and jurisdiction to protect the ongoing confidentiality of the ORSAA information.

ORSAA Account Creation

1. Student goes through FAFSA/ORSAA filter tool to determine if they should complete FAFSA, ORSAA, or neither
2. If eligible to submit ORSAA, click ORSAA button to go to ORSAA Student Portal (students should bookmark link for future use)
3. If new student, create account. If existing user, log in with credentials. **Students should contact ORSAAHelp@hecc.oregon.gov before attempting to make duplicate account.**
4. Student goes through the application (completing both student and parent sections, if applicable), and then electronically signs.
5. If dependent student, student sends electronic invite from ORSAA Form to parent (using the email they will use for their ORSAA Parent Account). **If parent already has parent account, use the same email for the parent.**
6. Parent logs into their email, clicks unique link that creates their account. Parent will need to enter in both student and parent name and DOB to confirm identity before account is created.
7. Parent reviews all answers, then electronically signs.

ORSAA Student Log In

- Students log in or create an account as the initial step
- Parents **cannot** proactively make their ORSAA Parent Account. They must wait until they receive the email invitation from the student (which is at the end of the student application process)
- If a student believes they have an ORSAA account, please have them contact ORSAAHelp@hecc.oregon.gov – it creates many issues if students make multiple accounts
- Students who need an account, click **Sign Up** at the bottom

ORSAA Eligibility Criteria

Students only need to complete one financial aid application per academic year (FAFSA or ORSAA). See below for eligibility criteria:

To complete the ORSAA you must meet one of the following criteria:

- Be an undocumented Oregon student
- Have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status, Temporary Protected Status (TPS), or a U-visa.

Do NOT complete the ORSAA if you are (1) a U.S. citizen, (2) a legal noncitizen with an Alien Registration number, or (3) an international student who is in the United States with a valid visa.

To complete the FAFSA you must meet one of the following criteria:

An eligible noncitizen is a U.S. national (includes natives of American Samoa or Swains Island), U.S. permanent resident (who has an I-151, I-551 or I-551C [Permanent Resident Card]), or an individual who has an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) showing one of the following designations:

- Refugee
- Asylum Granted
- Cuban-Haitian Entrant (Status Pending)
- Conditional Entrant (valid only if issued before April 1, 1980)
Victims of human trafficking, T-visa (T-2, T-3, or T-4, etc.) holder
- Parolee (You must be paroled into the United States for at least one year and you must be able to provide evidence from the USCIS that you are in the United States for other than a temporary purpose and that you intend to become a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.)



ORSAA Student Account Creation

- To create an ORSAA Student Account
 - Personal email address (do not use work or school address)
 - Password
- Once the student clicks continue, the system sends an email to validate the account. The validation steps works best if the student access the email verification from the same device as they are using to set up the account.

ORSAA Student Account Creation

- Once the student goes to their email validates their account, then they will be taken back to the ORSAA Student Log In screen
- Student now can log in with their email and password to complete account set up

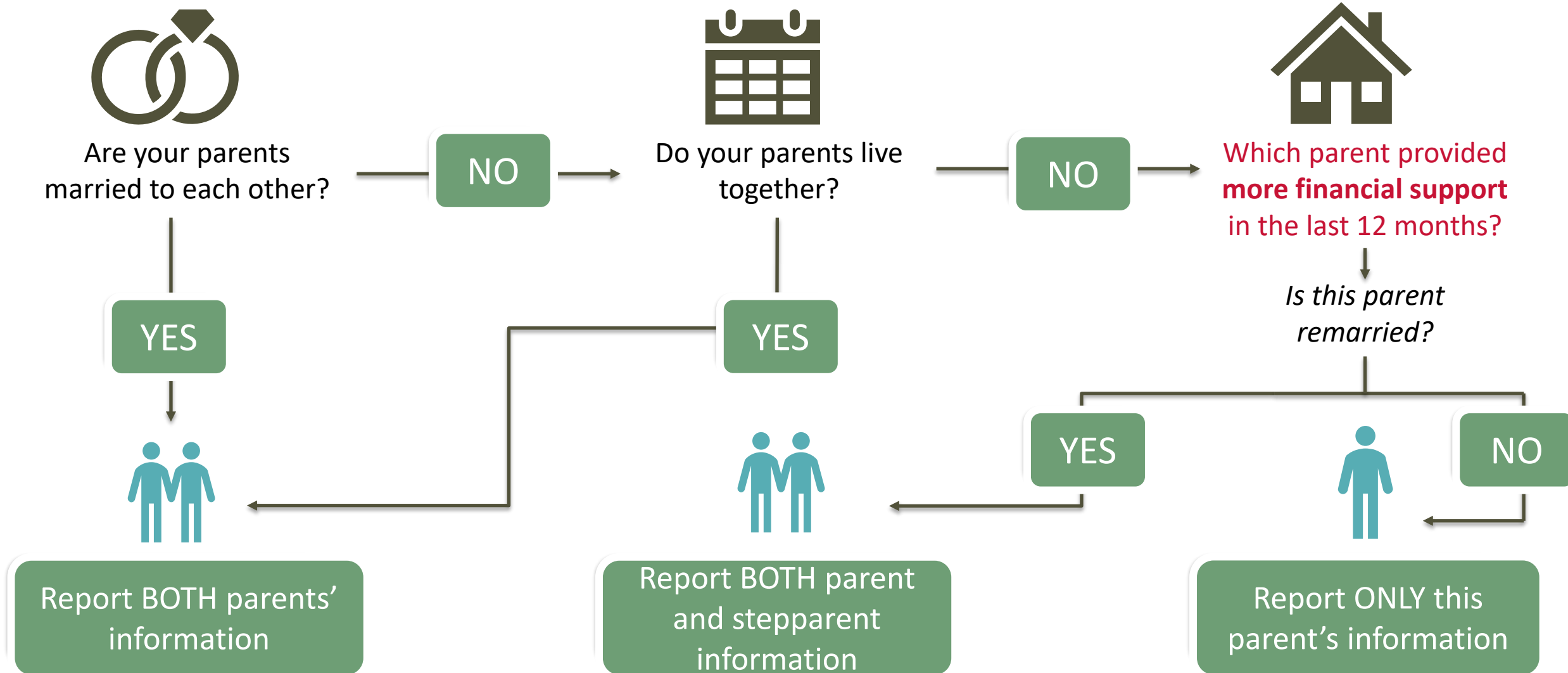

- Review information before next screen – this information must match as to what the parent will use to verify their ORSAA Parent Account
 - Many students make typos here, and it is key this information is entered correctly

Tax and Income Questions

- The ORSAA asks the same tax/income information as the FAFSA in order to calculate financial need. For the 2024-25 ORSAA, students and parents need to provide 2022 tax/income information (prior-prior year)
- All ORSAA tax and income questions must be entered manually – not connected to any database like the FAFSA
- First financial section is about student income, then later parent(s) income
- If parent(s) live outside the U.S., they must convert their earnings to U.S. dollar then enter in that amount into the ORSAA form

- This is the only way that OSAC can share ORSAA data with a school is by the student listing the institution on their ORSAA

Tuition Equity Questions

- Students must answer four Oregon-specific questions, known as the Tuition Equity questions
 - They do not have to answer yes to all in order to submit their ORSAA
 - These are additional criteria the student must meet to be considered for the Oregon Opportunity Grant and other items like: in-state tuition at public universities and Ford Family Foundation scholarships (both are separate applications)
1. Student attended an elementary or secondary/high school in Oregon during all three years immediately prior to earning a high school diploma or leaving school before earning a diploma
 2. Student attended an elementary or secondary/high school in the United States for at least five years immediately prior to earning a high school diploma or leaving school before earning a diploma
 3. Student received a high school diploma or GED® in Oregon
 4. Student certifies intention to become a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident

Signing and Submitting

1. If dependent student, parent and student must electronically sign (e-sign) the ORSAA
 1. Do not click “choose another option” for signature
2. After student e-signs, they must send parent an invite via email from the ORSAA application

Step 1: Signature Options

Signing and Submitting - Parent


1. After student signs, they click back to their ORSAA application and “request parent signature”
2. Student will choose a parent (if two listed) to sign ORSAA and enter in parent email – if parent has an ORSAA Parent account already, use that email. If not, type in email parent will use to create ORSAA parent account



Signing and Submitting - Parent

- Once parent is logged in, they will see the applications they have been invited to sign
- Parent clicks on the application – they have the option to review all answers (and can make edits) or they can skip to the signature section
- E-sign process identical to student e-sign process
- Once parent signs, then ORSAA is complete for dependent student
- ORSAA status will update to **Satisfied** in the student's application – this means their application is complete

ORSAA Submitted – What's Next?

- OSAC emails student within 1-2 weeks to confirm ORSAA submission
- OSAC emails students about potential errors on their submitted application
- ORSAA students can access their Student Aid Index (SAI) in their ORSAA application:
 - Log into ORSAA Student Portal
 - Click on **Documents**
 - Click on **Review and Update** on the application that is fully submitted – do NOT click start/edit/complete button
 - Click **green arrow** to download PDF of ORSAA – last page has SAI 
- ORSAA students can email OSAC to request a letter with their SAI if they need a formal letter for a scholarship application or if they cannot locate their SAI

ORSAA Submitted – Need to Make Edits/Updates?

- How to submit a revision:
 - Student should *FIRST* download PDF of the ORSAA, before clicking start/edit/complete button
 - Student will need to re-enter financial information (use PDF to be able to copy/reference prior answers)
 - Student will need to e-sign again – parent only needs to e-sign if any information in parent section was updated

OSAC Awarding Information

- Email notification about Oregon Opportunity Grant typically starts in Spring (if student is awarded)
- Students should complete other aid applications (OSAC Scholarships, Oregon Promise, campus, etc.). Notifications about those awards will come from the individual programs
- Students are encouraged to submit as many financial aid applications as possible: ORSAA, OSAC scholarships and grants, institutional aid, local scholarships, national scholarships, etc.

Understanding the ORSAA Oregon Student Aid Application



The ORSAA is the alternative to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for undocumented students in Oregon, including students with Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status. The ORSAA gives students access to state grants and scholarships.

WHO SHOULD SUBMIT AN ORSAA?

You should submit the ORSAA if you're an undocumented student, including DACA, TPS, or U-Visa status, and you are a new or continuing college student. You must currently live and study in Oregon.

WHY SHOULD I SUBMIT AN ORSAA?

By submitting the ORSAA - early, and each year you attend college - you can gain access to financial aid through the state of Oregon such as the Oregon Promise Grant, and OSAC Scholarships*. You must meet eligibility criteria for each program. Financial aid helps you meet the costs of attending college.

DO I NEED TO SUBMIT THE ORSAA AND THE FAFSA?

First, submit the ORSAA if you are an undocumented, DACA, TPS, or U-Visa student. Next, talk to the financial aid office at your school. Ask if you can complete anything else to apply for campus-based aid.

Quick tips to complete the ORSAA Oregon Student Aid Application



USE A PERMANENT EMAIL ADDRESS FOR YOUR ACCOUNT.
Remember your username and password so that you can log into your account later. Do not create multiple accounts.



READ AND ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS CAREFULLY.
Make sure you understand ORSAA questions before you answer them, so that you provide accurate information. If you're not sure what a question means, contact OSAC.



HAVE YOUR PARENT ELECTRONICALLY SIGN THE ORSAA.
All students must electronically sign (e-sign) their ORSAA. Most students under age 24 must also have a parent e-sign the ORSAA. If your ORSAA says "Request Parent Signature," then you need to click the buttons to invite your parent to sign your ORSAA. Your parent must use a different email address than the student's ORSAA account email.



GET TO SATISFIED!
Make sure your ORSAA status says "Satisfied". This means your ORSAA is submitted and you will be considered for Oregon financial aid opportunities. Save a copy of the PDF version of your completed ORSAA for your reference.

How is my ORSAA information used once I submit it?

Your ORSAA information goes to the Office of Student Access and Completion (OSAC) - the state financial aid office. OSAC only shares your information with the Oregon colleges and universities that you list on the ORSAA. All information is secure and confidential. The State of Oregon protects the privacy of individuals' immigration information, as described in House Bill 3464 (2017).

When will I know about financial aid awards?

When you submit the ORSAA, you will automatically be considered for the Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG). Oregon's largest need-based grant for college students. If you are awarded the OOG, you will receive an email from OSAC (typically in spring or summer) with award information.

What if I need to correct information on my ORSAA?

1. Log in to your ORSAA account, simply update your ORSAA information.
2. Download the PDF of your application before editing anything.
3. Edit the application. You will need to re-enter some financial information.
4. You must e-sign the ORSAA again. If dependent student, your parent may need to e-sign again.
5. Make sure your status says "Satisfied" at the end.
