INFORMATION SHEET FOR NURSING STUDENTS FROM BRECKINRIDGE AT ITT

September 9, 2016

All appropriate Oregon state agencies are actively involved in developing pathways and remedies for students from the Breckinridge at ITT program to continue progression toward a nursing degree. The urgency of the situation is understood but planning for a successful outcome may take a few weeks. The goal is to establish pathways that allow students to finish the degree they started.

In the interim, here are some facts:

1. Regarding the Exit HESI Exam Requirement

ITT-Tech and Breckinridge School of Nursing have made a formal change to the exit HESI testing policy. This change allows for a student who has **completed and passed their final quarter courses** to be issued a final transcript showing the degree awarded even if the HESI exam was not taken or not passed. This individual is a graduate and can apply for the nursing license by examination. For those seeking licensure in Oregon, the application form is available through this link:

Completing the license examination application is your first step and will lead you along to other required steps.

2. Seeking the CNA1 and/or CNA2 Certificate

Students who have **passed the following courses may apply for CNA1:**

NU 100, NU 131, NU 1326 (was NU 110), and NU 1422 (was NU 120)

Request that your transcript be forwarded to the Oregon State Board of Nursing.

Students who have **passed the following courses may apply for CNA2:**

NU 100, NU 131, NU 1326 (was NU 1110), NU 1422 (was NU 120), and NU 230

Request that your transcript be forwarded to the Oregon State Board of Nursing.

Note: If you aren't already a CNA1, you must apply for CNA1 and CNA2 at the same time to obtain the CNA2.

3. Seeking Transfer Into Another Nursing Program

Until formal plans are developed specific to the students from the Breckinridge at ITT program and disseminated to college admissions staff, any student who seeks information from colleges in Oregon will likely hear the same information provided to any student who is asking about transferring to that college. This information usually includes limitations on the ability to accept transfer credits, the limits on numbers of credits that may be accepted, competitive admission processes for nursing programs, etc. It is understandable that students want to be proactive in finding a way to continue their education, however. Please be aware that information available on admission and transfer credits as of today is not likely to address your unique situation.
