- No Prior Experience Necessary

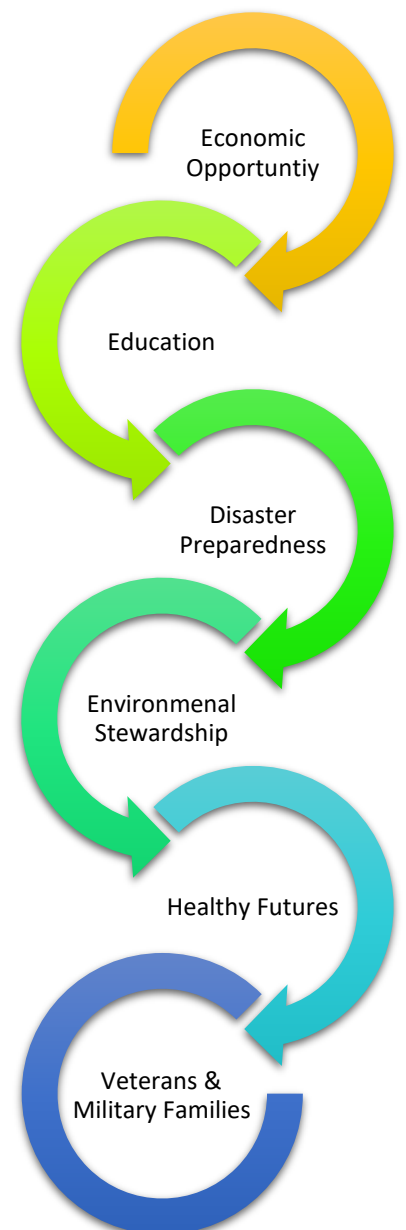
