Oregon Promise is a state grant that helps cover tuition at any Oregon community college for recent high school and GED® test graduates.

This resource is for students who are released from an Oregon correctional facility and may be eligible for special consideration under HB 2910 (2019).



Earn Oregon high school diploma or GED® test credential on or after 1/1/20, while in a correctional facility

Earn a 2.50 cumulative GPA or higher, or pass all four GED® tests

Attend an Oregon community college within 6 months of release

Oregon resident for at least 12 months prior to attending college

Your eligibility may also be determined by your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). EFC criteria are subject to change. Check website for details.

All deadlines are 5:00 pm PT. If deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, it automatically extends to 5:00 pm the following business day.
